August 1, 2009 was the one-year anniversary of Kacy White's assumption of Leonard Heydt's duties when I consolidated the positions of Clerk and Administrator. Hurricane Ike in September 2008, the ice storm last January, and the flood in August were all declared major disasters by the federal government. On each occasion Kacy took immediate action to turn out our contractors, and each time our roads were clear on the day of the storm before the sun set. Kacy also handled the complicated cost reimbursement process with FEMA, which resulted in payments of over \$80,000 to Glenview.

I am proud of Kacy, and I speak for the entire Glenview Commission when I say we are pleased with the job she does for Glenview. We all strive to provide you professionalism, courtesy, and trust in our service to you as your City of Glenview government.

**NO HUNTING**

There were gun shots two weeks ago at night in Glenview, and a dead wild turkey was found the next day near where the shots were heard. Another neighbor found a deer stand in a tree next to his property, and a feeder to attract game. Poaching a wild turkey at night is a very serious offense. Discharging a firearm near someone's home could lead to criminal charges of endangerment.

Please note that hunting is prohibited by Glenview Ordinance No. 4 Series 1988 which states that, "It shall be unlawful for any persons to hunt any animal with any firearm or weapon, including bow and arrow and any weapons from which a projectile, metal shot or pellet is or may be propelled or discharged under pressure" A fine in the amount of One Hundred Dollars shall be imposed for each violation. Any police officer is authorized and directed to confiscate any firearms.

Contractors who come to Glenview homes to work are impressed by our abundant wildlife. Please be sure and let all contractors know that hunting in Glenview is illegal. Report hunters to Metro Police by calling 911. You can also report illegal hunting by calling the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife, 1-800-25 -ALERT

### **Glenview Ave**

I hope you have noticed the recently installed cat eyes along the edge of Glenview where the road runs along the creek. The City had to install them for safety reasons. The road is caving in towards the creek because the road should not have been widened. Louisville Paving told the city this in 2005, but the road was widened anyway. Our city engineer determined that a 25 mph speed along that stretch of Glenview is too fast, so we put up the 15 mph signs, and low shoulder signs. In order to maintain our rural character, the City chose to go with the signage and cat eyes, instead of white lines on the side of the road and guard rails.

It was the city engineer who pulled out the 25 mph sign that lay on the ground for so long. For the sake of economy we wanted all of the sign work done at the same time. I know it seems like it took forever to get the replacement street signs for Arden Road and Glenview Avenue that were destroyed during the ice storm. Matching the old signs with new reflective ones took a while. Thank you for your patience for the long time that the 25 mph sign laid there, and we were without street signs.

### **Woodside Road**

The City has accepted EZ Construction's proposal for drainage work along Woodside Road. They are going to install a cross drain, and restore some existing drains that are clogged up and out of service. The City is doing the drainage work now so Woodside can be resurfaced next year. MSD does not maintain drains, and we can use your help

to keep our drainage systems clear. Anytime you or your yard men can shovel a drain, or re-open a pipe, please do.

### **Winter Road Care**

The City has re-newed our contract with Vaughn Construction for snow removal. They did a great job the past 2 winters, and we look forward to working with them again. They will not be plowing private drives, if you want your private drive plowed it will be your responsibility to hire someone.

### **LG&E**

LG& E will be coming early next year to trim trees around their electrical wires, and possibly install stronger wires and poles to lessen power outages like those in the recent ice and wind storms. When they come to your door to let you know when they will be trimming in your yard, please read all the paperwork before signing off on anything, and make sure that they are going to pick up the tree trimmings. ### **Insurance Tax Premiums**

Insurance premium taxes have been discussed in the *GLENVIEW NEWSLETTER* on several occasions. The State of Kentucky provides a tax on insurance premiums. The City must be on record requesting the funds. Glenview went on record several years ago and this valuable revenue stream has helped to keep the Glenview property tax rate extremely low. Please make sure your agent or insurance company is aware that you live in Glenview. This is extremely important if you have a zip code other than 40025. If your insurance company is not aware that you live in Glenview the tax revenue will go to Metro Louisville by default. Attached are a few more stickers for your premium payments. Just affix them to the bill when you mail in the payment.
