CITY OF GLENVIEW, KENTUCKY ORDINANCE NO. 4, SERIES 2015

AN ORDINANCE PREVENTING LITTERING WITHIN THE CITY OF GLENVIEW, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the City desires to maintain the cleanliness of the City that is a residential neighborhood, and

WHEREAS, the City desires to protect the scenic beauty and the health, safety and welfare of its residents by preventing littering within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF GLENVIEW, KENTUCKY, as follows:

Section 1. Definitions.

For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.

"GARBAGE." Animal and vegetable wastes resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of food.

"LITTER." Garbage, refuse, and rubbish as defined herein.

"PRIVATE PROPERTY." Any dwelling, house, building, or other structure designed or used either wholly or in part for private residential purposes, whether inhabited, temporarily or continuously uninhabited, or vacant, and shall include any yard, grounds, walk, driveway, porch, steps, vestibule, or mailbox belonging or appurtenant to the dwelling, house, building, or other structure.

"<u>PUBLIC PLACES</u>." Any and all streets, sidewalks, boulevards, alleys, right-of-ways or other public ways, and any and all public parks, squares, spaces, grounds, and buildings.

"<u>REFUSE</u>." All solid wastes including garbage, rubbish, ashes, street cleanings, dead animals, abandoned automobiles, and solid market and industrial wastes.

"RUBBISH." Wastes, such as paper, wrappings, cigarettes, cardboard, tin cans, yard clippings, leaves, wood, glass, bedding, crockery, and similar materials.

Section 2. Throwing Litter from Vehicle.

No person while a driver or passenger in a vehicle shall throw or deposit litter upon any street or other public place within the City or upon private property.

Section 3. Hauling Loose Material.

Every person hauling or causing to be hauled dirt, sand, gravel, cement, fill dirt, or loose material of any kind in or upon any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public place shall haul it, or cause it to be hauled to prevent any of the contents from falling or being thrown, blown, or deposited upon any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public place. Any materials which fall from, or which are thrown, blown or deposited from any vehicle upon any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public place, shall be removed immediately by the person in charge of the vehicle.

Section 4. Sweeping Litter Into Gutters.

No person shall sweep into or deposit in any gutter, street, or other public place within the City the accumulation of litter from any building or lot from any public or private sidewalk or driveway.

Section 5. <u>Litter on Private Property or Public Places.</u>

No person shall throw or deposit litter in any public or private area of the city, except in public receptacles and in a manner that the litter will be prevented from being carried or deposited by the elements upon any part of the public or private property, or upon any street or other public area. Where public receptacles are not provided, all litter shall be carried away from the property by the person responsible for its presence and properly disposed of elsewhere as provided herein.

Section 6. Penalty.

Each Offense: A fine of \$500.00, if paid within 30 days of citation; an additional \$100.00 if not paid within 30 days of citation, plus interest at the rate of 1% per month, compounded monthly; and the addition of attorney fees and legal costs if not paid within 90 days.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication.
